Ag Scholarships

The CHS Foundation will award nearly 300 scholarships through two programs to students with agriculture or energy related interests throughout the U.S. and Canada. Graduating high school seniors pursuing a degree in an agricultural-related field at any college or university throughout the United States and Canada are invited to apply for one of 100 \$1,000 scholarships. Applications are due March 31, 2017. CHS and the CHS Foundation will fund nearly 200 scholarships to students enrolled in an agricultural-related program at partnering two- and four-year colleges and universities throughout the United States. Scholarship awards range from \$1,000 to \$2,000. Alpha Gamma Rho Fraternity at the University of Nebraska- Lincoln is offering two \$1,000 scholarships to males who will be attending UNL with an agriculture major this fall. Alpha Gamma Rho is a social/professional fraternity that offers an immense network within the agriculture industry. Students applying for the \$1000 Nebraska Seed Trade Association Freshman Scholarship must be a new student enrolling at the University of Nebraska. They must possess a strong interest in the area of seed industry, crop production, seed technology, or plant breeding and major in a degree program offered by the Department of Agronomy and Horticulture, College of Agricultural Sciences and Natural Resources, Institute of Agriculture and Natural Resources, University of Nebraska.
