

The 3rd quarter is nearing the end and will be wrapping up on March 15th. Hopefully that means spring will be here to stay before we know it! You can expect report cards to go home at the end of the following week. A few points to highlight below:

- 1.) **1 Book 1 School** wrapped up last week. I hope you all enjoyed reading Shredderman! Thanks again to REF for helping with the cost. A special thanks to Mrs. Guenther, Mrs. Shearer, and Mrs. Thelen for leading this activity as well.
- 2.) **Read Across America Week** will be taking place March 4th-7th. Activities are planned for each day as well as REF will be sponsoring a Read-a-thon again this year on Thursday March 7th. Thank you to Mrs. Harder and Mrs. Hegge for planning the week.
- 3.) **Kindergarten Round-up** will take place on Friday March 15th from 8:30 a.m.-10:30 a.m. There will be no kindergarten for current kindergarten students that day. Children that will be 5 years old on or before July 31st are eligible to attend Kindergarten as stated by Nebraska State Law. Please contact the elementary office if you have not received any information about Kindergarten Round-up.
- 4.) **Spring Testing** will begin after Easter break and be completed by the end of April. Students in grades 3-6 will take the state NSCAS test in math and language arts. The 5th grade students will also take a science test as well. Exact dates will be communicated as we get closer. It is important that your child gets plenty of rest on testing weeks as well as positive encouragement to try their best.
- 5.) **Date Changes** school will be in session April 8th, April 15th, and April 22nd.
- 6.) **PBIS** students have been reviewing bathroom, library, and cafeteria expectations as well as reporting a problem to an adult. They also did a compliment activity during Cardinal Families.
- 7.) **Family Engagement**, continuing to read as a family so your child can turn in their minutes for their library challenge. Math facts for 5 minutes a few nights a week. Make it fun, such as read outside or go to the park as the weather continues to get nicer.
- 8.) As always do not hesitate to reach out to myself or your child's teacher if you have any questions or concerns.
