

- 1.) **PBIS Rotation Stations** will again take place in January like we did in August. This will be to review expected behaviors for all the common areas around the school. This will take place the first two afternoons.
- 2.) **AimswEB Winter testing** took place in early December. Results will be sent home with report cards. Please contact your child's teacher if you have any concerns.
- 3.) **Individualized Reading Plans (IRIPS)** have been updated in grades K-3. You will receive a letter in your child's report card if any changes were made in regards to a current IRIP or a new IRIP.
- 4.) **Report Cards** will come home the week of **January 6th-10th**.
- 5.) **Interventions** will start back up on **January 9th**. The data from AIMS benchmark testing was taken and students were put into intervention groups based on their reading needs. Please contact your child's teacher if you have questions why your child is placed where they are.
- 6.) **Backpack Program** if you believe your child would benefit from the backpack program please reach out to Mr. Beacom. The backpack program provides a bag of snacks over each weekend during the school year.
- 7.) Check with your child or your child's teacher to see if they need **to restock any school supplies** as we start 2nd semester.
- 8.) **Colder weather**, as winter continues, just a reminder your child needs a winter coat, boots, hat, and gloves. Please help your child remember these items. We will go outside unless the office decides it is too cold/safe to have recess.
- 9.) **Parent Teacher Conferences** will be Monday February 3rd. Save the date as more info will come in January!
- 10.) As always do not hesitate to reach out to myself or your child's teacher!
